DEMARCATION OF A JURISDICTIONAL LINE IN AMISTAD RESERVOIR

The Commission met in the offices of the Mexican Section at Ciudad Juarez, Chihuahua at 11:00 a.m., May 9, 1968, to consider the demarcation of the jurisdictional line at Amistad Reservoir pursuant to Article 21 of the 1944 Water Treaty.

The Commission reviewed the "Report of the Principal Engineers Regarding the Demarcation of the Jurisdictional Line at Amistad Reservoir" and its exhibits, submitted by Principal Engineers Lyle H. Henderson and Jenaro Paz Reyes under date of May 6, 1968 and found its recommendations to be both feasible and in conformity with the provisions of the Water Treaty. The texts in English and in Spanish of the Report in reference and its exhibits are attached hereto and form part hereof.

Accordingly, the Commission adopted the following resolution, subject to the approval of the two Governments:

The Commission approves establishment of the line according to the recommendations of the "Report of the Principal Engineers Regarding the Demarcation of the Jurisdictional Line at Amistad Reservoir" dated May 6, 1968, and recommends that it be approved by the two Governments for the exercise of the jurisdiction and control vested by the Water Treaty in the Commission and its respective Sections, and to mark the boundary for the application of the customs and police regulations of each country, pursuant to Article 21 of that Treaty.
